

At Meir Heath Academy, phonics plays an instrinsic part in teaching and learning within EYFS and Key Stage 1.

Teachers use 'Supersonic Phonic Friends' as a tool to support the delivery of phonics. This uses the Letters and Sounds framework to structure lessons and engage the children with a range of characters, visuals, mnemonics and interactive resources.

Phonics is taught daily and within the sessions, children have the opportunuites to:

review their previous learning,

be taught brand new phonics learning,

practise the new learning and build on previous learning

and

apply their new learning in a range of reading and writing based activities.

Reading at home every night is encouraged and rewarded as this supports children's in-school learning. Reading books are carefully matched to children's phonic phrases. We offer a range of fiction and non-fiction publications to ensure children are exposed to a variety of styles of writing and different formats for reading such as:

- Rising Stars
- Collins Big Cat
- Oxford Reading Tree
- Bug Club
- Songbirds

At Meir Heath Academy we teach the children that 'Reading is the key to all learning'. Phonics is extremely important in ensuring children develop an understanding of letters, sounds and eventually words to enable them to read, write and engage in the world around them.

By the end of Year 2, most children will have completed the phonics scheme of learning and are ready to access the spelling programme that we offer at Meir Heath Academy. However, no child is left behind. For a small number of children that may require further teaching to support reading and writing, we offer further intervention support in Years 3, 4, 5 and 6 where required.
