As we come to the end of a busy and exciting Spring Term 2, I want to take a moment to thank you all for your continued support and to share some of the wonderful learning that has taken place across the school.

In EYFS, the children have been exploring the theme of New Life, sparked by classic stories like The Very Hungry Caterpillar. This much-loved tale has helped our youngest learners understand life cycles. The children have especially enjoyed scanning and using QR codes in the reading area to access and sing along to their favourite nursery rhymes, adding an extra layer of fun to their imaginative play and bringing lots of smiles and laughter to the classroom.

In the Infant classes, English lessons have been a true treat—quite literally! Charlie and the Chocolate Factory has captured imaginations, inspiring creative writing and storytelling. The children have also travelled the globe in their geography lessons, learning about hot and cold countries, and even delving into the vibrant world of Aztec sun artwork, bringing culture and colour into the classroom.

Year Three has been buzzing with curiosity as they journeyed across North America. From using maps to locate countries and major cities, to understanding both human and physical geography, they've taken a deep dive into the continent's diverse environments. Their art lessons have been equally exciting, with a focus on drawing and painting Walt Disney characters—a brilliant blend of geography and creativity!

Year Four have been diving into the fascinating world of the Vikings. They've explored Viking life, traditions, and impact on Britain through engaging history lessons and creative classwork. Their curiosity and enthusiasm have really brought this historical era to life!

Year Five have turned their attention to space, guided by the exciting book *Cosmic*. Their learning reached new heights with a memorable visit to the National Space Centre, where they took part in a hands-on workshop programming a Rover Robot. It was an inspiring experience that deepened their understanding of our universe and sparked plenty of wonder!

Finally, Year Six have been reflecting on the powerful theme of Freedom and survival, studying history that has shaped the world we live in. They've also deepened their historical knowledge with a study focusing on key aspects of British history beyond 1066, encouraging thoughtful discussion and critical thinking.

As always, it's a joy to see the enthusiasm, creativity and progress of our pupils. We are incredibly proud of all they've achieved this term and look forward to an exciting Summer Term ahead.

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CELEBRATING EID


During this term we have experienced our fourth RE Day of the academic year, and this time it was focused on Eid al-Fitr.

- Year 6 – Bridget Riley: optical art and visual movement
